- Set fish traps at Winter Lakes
- Jordon Cove project permit denied; looked at facility and bay dredging, concern about fish & wildlife habitats.
- Discussed how they might offset and mitigate the pipeline.
- Claim to seed, mulch, and lay down wood to conserve soil; project will cross ag land
